Developed by the Rochdale Society of Equitable Pioneers in Rochdale England, the founding of the Rochdale Principles are a set of values and ideals for co-operative enterprises, which form the basis on which co-operatives around the world operate to this day.



1925

Birth of Singapore's First Co-operative

The Singapore Government Staff Credit Co-operative Society was Singapore's first co-operative, founded on 7th October 1925 against the backdrop of unscrupulous money lenders profiteering from low wage earners. The co-operative offered safe banking and affordable loans to employees in the Civil Service, Statutory Boards and Government-Owned Companies. To this day, the co-operative continues to champion this social mission for Civil Service employees, including numerous benefits for members.



1969 Birth of the NTUC Co-operatives

As a result of the NTUC seminar on "The Modernization of the Labor Movement", the NTUC Co-operatives were born. Inspired by Singapore's founding fathers, the late Deputy Prime Minister Dr Goh Keng Swee, and the country's late President Mr C.V. Devan Nair, these co-operatives were founded to help moderate the cost of living for the common man, provide access to affordable essential products and services, and help each worker 'stretch the dollar'. Some of these co-operatives continue to make significant impact at the national level.

1980

Birth of the Singapore National Co-operative Federation

By an Act of Parliament, the Singapore National Co-operative Federation (SNCF) was registered on 18 September 1980 as the national body for the Singapore's Co-operative Movement. Its mission is to promote and develop co-operatives as sustainable enterprises that address social and economic needs through the principle of self and mutual help so as to foster a more resilient society.

2012

Singapore Celebrates United Nations International Year of Co-operatives

The United Nations proclaimed 2012 as the International Year of Co-operatives, in recognition of the exemplary model of co-operative enterprises, through which a better world may be realized. Led by SNCF, Singapore joins the world community in celebrating the International Year of Co-operatives 2012.


シンガポールでは、2012年の国際協同組合年(IYC)を記念する切手が限定発行されましたので、ここにお送りいたします。
